# MOVE ON

#### An Art Is... major community art project



An artistic collaboration between Jans Altheimer, Mandy Field, Sam Deal and local artist Dave Jones -Part kinetic sculpture, part storytelling, part human-activated contraption - MOVE ON is a community arts creative maker and performance project.

A series of workshops, led by an artistic team of professional artists, working with diverse community groups including CALD groups working through the Centre for Participation; Haven and Dimboola Primary Schools' Year 5-6 students, will culminate into one mechanical, moving, masterpiece.

An artwork made for interaction, celebrating cause and effect at its core, enticing and inviting the public to play. Sculptures will be created from an improbable assortment of objects, including industrial parts, A agriculture machinery and common household items like kettles or wardrobes. Gravity, collisions and chemistry will be utilised to create spectacular chain reactions and self-destructing 'performances' of physical interactions and precisely crafted chaos, worthy of a Rube Goldberg machine.

Stories will be captured using different creative forms including music, storytelling, puppetry, movement and circus.

Workshops will be delivered in Dimboola, Haven and Horsham in May. We still require adult participation if interested or if you have interesting items ie. machinery, pipes, or items that you think might work on this project please contact the Project Manager Sarah Natali on 0468387121.

# **CRAFTING CIVIC PRID**

A Craft Victoria Touring Exhibition & A Horsham Regional Art Gallery Exhibition presented as part of the Art Is... 2017 Festival

Inspired by the craftsmanship and legacy integral to the Mayoral chain this exhibition unpacks traditional ways of making and traditional ceremonies within contemporary society.

Commissioned by Craft Victoria, ten contemporary Melbourne artists have responded to the City of Melbourne Mayoral Chain, producing artworks that explore notions of grandeur and responsibility through materials and processes. This exploration includes installations to challenge ideas surrounding wearability while interactive works question preciousness of material and production.

The history of our own civic life will be sampled as we present Mayoral chains and photographic documentation of the former and current shires of the Horsham, Northern Grampians, Hindmarsh, West Wimmera and Yarriambiak. We 6 proudly present the craftsmanship of these ornamental objects and key moments when they adorned the shoulders of men and women in civic ceremony.

Illuminating this further, we have invited two contemporary artists from our region, Wotjobaluk/Jupagalk/ Jadawadjali Traditional Owner, Gail Harradine and St Arnaud's Aaron Carter to respond and create new artwork, exploring ways of making, materials and ceremony.

Craft as a discipline has a history of enormous social and political power, Crafting Civic Pride enables Victorian makers to make comment on the ways of making, progress in technology and industry and to discuss the social status of adornment through jewellery.

# CON KROKER: CLOSE IIP

We live in a world of remarkable beauty, often so subtle and delicate that it is imperceptible to the human eye. To bring these details to light, Con Kroker framed this view through a camera lens. Holding the image in a photographic negative, became short hand for how he experienced, saw and recorded nature close up.

Born in Horsham in 1910, Conrad Otto Kroker had a lifelong love of photography. Living almost all of his life on the land, the wildlife and the landscape of the Western District became his natural subjects.



### Walking at LAHARUM GROVE



The location: The olive grove was planted in 1943 in a traditional grid pattern. The established trees form avenues that provide spectacular sightline to the eastern wall of the Grampians and being situated on a gentle slope, towards wide and open spaces to the east.

The activity: Participants collect a set of directional instructions, and reflective cues regarding listening, looking or smelling. They select a notebook or sketchbook, a rug or a stool and using the instructions find their way to their destination. Once there they implement the instruction for repose. The participant can continue exploring the grove or return for a further set of instruction cards. The activity and rugs, stools, sketchbooks/notebooks and pencil/ pens are provided without cost to the participant.


### JOURNEY TO THE CENTRE OF THE EARTH

#### Encounter Performance Day


